National Water Week **Short Film Competition** for Primary & High School Students

The National Water Week Short Film Competition is run by the Australian Water Association and is open to all primary and high school students across Australia.

Students must come up with a short film that responds in part or full to the question:

“What can we do to make sure there’s water for me and water for all?”

Entries will be judged on the most creative responses to the guiding question.

There are two prizes to be won; one for primary school entries and one for high school entries.

Competition Guidelines:

1. This competition runs from 10 September 2018 to 16 November 2018.
2. Judging will be conducted by Australian Water Association staff members from 19-21 November 2018.
3. Winners will be notified by the Australian Water Association on 22 November 2018 and the winning entries will be announced across the Association's digital platforms from 23 November 2018.
4. The winners will each receive a prize valued at \$200.
5. Judging decisions are final.
6. Prizes are not redeemable for cash or services.
7. Employees of the Australian Water Association and their families are ineligible to enter.

You must obtain a signed parental consent form for every student who is visibly recognisable in your short film. You can use the form on the next page. By signing the form, you agree to the returned entry being uploaded across the Australian Water Association's digital platforms for promotional purposes.
